It seems like another band-aid solution that politicians can offer while not actually doing anything and waiting for everyone to forget what happened. It needs to be acknowledged that we are living in a climate emergency and natural disasters like the January 2020 ones are going to happen again and more frequently. I hope that the Royal Commission is looking at the science and the changing climate and Australia's part in that changing climate. I would also like some answers as to why the findings of previous Royal Commissions into bushfires have been ignored and why government thinks that climate science is not worth believing.
